#### **DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE**

It is so interesting to follow the current conversation around teaching literacy (and numeracy) in New Zealand. I am sure Jean Seabrook would be delighted in the proposed changes focusing on the evidence-based approach for teaching reading. The lack of focus on teaching essential skills was the reason she pushed for changes way back in the 1980's – before it was called 'structured literacy'!

We are very grateful to our generous funders who have made untagged donations recently. This has allowed us to fix the leaking butynol section of our roof, address longstanding maintenance issues and to employ Camila Olivero, a skilled student who is working on a Post Graduate Diploma in Applied Data Science, to work on the long overdue replacement of our database.

The Centre's next big challenge is revitalising the *Certificate in Specialist Teaching of Ākonga/Individuals* with SLD. (Cert.Tchg SLD). Over the years, we found that NZQA's reporting requirements are not suitable for a small, charitable organisation with adult trainees. Now that we are independent of NZQA, we can focus time and energy on outsourcing a course that best supplies our needs for a pool of qualified specialist teacher-tutors.

In February 2024, we were delighted to welcome Helen Bell to the Centre Manager role. She comes with much expertise in legal administration and accounting fields. Her skills have already benefited the Centre. We appointed Ozzie Forsyth in the Teaching Team Liaison role. Ozzie is an experienced teacher-tutor who have a long association with the Centre.

The Assessment Team is strong with seven part-time assessors working with Rebecca Dowling the Team leader.

Much thanks to you for your support to enable us to achieve our mission.
